#### Level 6 Camp to Marysville

I had the pleasure of attending the Level 6 Camp to Marysville. The students had an action packed week which allowed them to develop skills such as teamwork, leadership and persistence. So many students stepped out of their comfort zones to build their self-confidence. Some of my personal highlights included:

• Working as a team to ensure

 Working as a team to ensure that the wet weather gear lent to us by the camp was hung in the drying room. The camp staff were so impressed with the Hughesdale Crew who happily helped, many hands making light work. • Seeing my group complete the 'Spider web initiative' successfully in different ways. The team initially struggled to have each member pass from one side of the web to the other without using the same section twice. The first attempt failed; the second attempt was a free for all with many people yelling ideas. The third attempt was with two appointed leaders, and we reflected on how this change improved the completion of the task.



• Seeing students relish the responsibility of 'duty groups.' Before and after each meal a team would take on tasks to benefit the whole group with a great sense of responsibility.





#### **Mathematics**

I would like to acknowledge the work of our teachers Ashley Carey, Amy Mulcahy and Dave Meier who have led the staff in learning to consolidate the use of Maths Talks in the classroom to develop flexible thinking in our learners. Maths Talks have been

used at Hughesdale for 12 months now and are an opportunity for students to be guided in discussion around a mathematical problem that can be solved in multiple ways. This teaching tool is powerful for developing reasoning and understanding. In today's classroom, we emphasise learning mathematics with understanding rather than remembering rules and procedures

which may not 'make sense.'
Mathematics makes sense when it is taught with an emphasis on developing deep understanding. We encourage students to develop their own strategies for working out mathematics problems and create connections and relationships across topics. A strong message that is conveyed is that there are lots of ways to do maths problems. Some ways are more efficient than others, but we shouldn't say there is any one right way to do a given problem. Some of the language you may hear during these sessions from students...


- the rich and thriving culture, knowledge and experience of our First Nations peoples are celebrated by all Victorians


#### The Big Double Excursion


