Acting Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term Three. I hope everyone had a great break. I can't believe I have nearly finished my second week here at HPS, how time flies when you're having fun!! What a wonderful community, I am very lucky to be part of it.

Prep enrolments for 2024 are being accepted and should be submitted by the end of term. If you know of families interested in attending Hughesdale Primary School in 2024, please encourage them to contact the school.

Students arriving at school early is quite a concern for any school. The school grounds are not supervised until **8.45am.** I understand students are very excited to shoot some hoops or kick a ball before class starts, however, I encourage parents to ensure your child/ren are not arriving before the designated supervised time, 8.45am.

NAPLAN results for students of year 3 and 5 are being released from Monday 17 July 2023, we currently have not received our hard copy results. I'm writing to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are: \cdot exceeding \cdot strong \cdot developing \cdot needs additional support.

This change will give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels.

Sick Children: Parents are asked not to send their child/ren to school if they are at all unwell. Given the low immunity within the community at the moment, we understand that your children are coming down with colds and other illnesses more often and therefore missing more school than usual. For the wellbeing of the whole school community, we request that you keep your children at home if they are unwell. Please test your child if they have any COVID like symptoms.

President's Report

Dear HPS Community,

School Council held our first meeting of Term 3 on Monday night (17/7), where we had our first and new funding for opportunity to welcome Dean Napier, acting Principal and Racheal Oster, Business Manager to the HPS community. Hopefully, many in our community got a chance to 'check out the new Principal' at our Friday morning coffee catch-up. It was a wonderful turnout and I thank everyone for making the time and hope to been installed between the running track and the oval. They look incredible and I invite our community to promised more fun and new funding for moderates needs.

Disability Inclusion Dean Napier has ex develop a plan for his to benefit as many Council will discuss becomes available.

I would also like to thank parents for paying their 2023 voluntary and essential fees. The fees that you pay not only help to provide your child with the basics but help to support a 1:1 digital provision for the kids, pay for sick bay supplies, purchase library books, help to maintain our building and grounds, pay for repairs and upgrades and purchase those big-ticket items like painting and carpets. If you have yet to pay your fees, it's not too late. In past years, state schools have received 90.2% of their budgetary needs. This is set to increase to 95% (75% State Govt, 20% Cth) at some point in 2024. All of this means your fees are essential for providing the basics, covering the funding gap and providing all the special things that make HPS such a wonderful place. Thank-you.

At last night's meeting the following was discussed:

<u>Camps:</u> The Lvl 3 and 4 Camps to the Philip Island Adventure resort have been approved. A reminder that HPS has received extra State Govt funding which we have used to <u>extend the LV 6 Camp</u> to 4 nights/5days. Last night we approved the risk assessment for the Lvl 5/6 Camps to Marysville. Further communications will come directly via the school.

Staffing: The seasonal flu, cold season and COVID continue to have an impact on staffing and our ability to employ CRTs to cover sick days. HPS remains committed to ensuring that there is a teacher for each class. This is achieved by using multiple staffing agencies, utilising our regular CRT's and having our Principal cohort step in as required. However, there are occasions where class splitting occurs within year levels. This is a last resort and HPS is working hard behind the scenes to prevent this.

<u>Disability Inclusion Funding (DIP)</u>: HPS is due to transition to DIP funding in 2024. School Council discussed what the funding was for and how this

funding could be used. The Vic government has promised more funding for children with a disability and new funding for children who may have low to moderates needs. For more information, go to Disability Inclusion (education.vic.gov.au)

Dean Napier has experience in this area and will develop a plan for how HPS may best use this funding to benefit as many students as possible. School Council will discuss the plan in more detail when it becomes available

<u>Finance Committee</u> - The Finance & Facilities Committee resolved that the revenue and expenditure for 2022 was in line with the 2022 confirmed operating budget. This Committee resolved that the reports that they reviewed represented the financial transactions for the school.

2nd Hand Uniform Stall: The 2nd hand uniform stall was developed to provide a cheaper alternative when our uniform shop (selling new uniform) moved offsite to our supplier PSW. Our onsite (old) uniform shop was a small business on its own and required proper financial oversight which was undertaken through the finance committee. However, our 2nd hand uniform stall does not need this same level of oversight and has been run by the P&F committee since it began. Therefore, school council approved the transition of the 2nd hand uniform stall from the finance committee to the Parents & Friends Committee. Money raised from the Stall will go towards to P&F fundraising goal. Price Increase: A price increase to items sold at the Stall was approved. Prices have increased from \$2/\$5 to \$5/\$10. EFTPOS facilities will also be available at the Stall. Please see the 2nd Hand Uniform Shop Report (in this newsletter) for more details. Parents & Friends Committee: The disco will be P&F's first cashless event. Please see the P&F Report (in this newsletter) for all the updates for all our Term 3 events.

Term 2 Building and Maintenance



Assistant Principal's Report

AMANDA SEACH

This term we have welcomed Dean Napier to our school as the Acting Principal. Our Department of Education Senior Education Improvement Leader facilitated the recruitment of this position and our gratitude is extended to our School Council President, Kirsten, for participating in the panel. I returned from Long Service Leave this week and it was most pleasing to see settled classes across the school.

On Tuesday, the Principal Class and Learning Specialists had a planning meeting with our Senior Education Improvement Leader and have devised a thorough plan to complete our Pre-School Review Self-Evaluation processes this term. Each four years schools complete a review which allows them to reflect, using the Department of Education's Framework for Improving Student Outcomes, on their strengths and improvement needs in the areas of Teaching and Learning, Assessment, Engagement, Leadership and Support and Resources. Our review will take place in Term 4 and we will be well prepared for it.

Our teacher professional learning has continued with a focus on Mathematics. At the end of Term 2 teachers participated in a workshop focussed on the use of

Essential Assessment as an assessment tool in classrooms from Levels 3 -6. We also had our Mathematics consultant from Melbourne University, Ryan Dunn, return on our Curriculum Day with a workshop focused on building teacher expertise, in particular the value of talk and how teachers can guide students' conversations along with the development and use of rich tasks.

This week teachers took time to refocus and refresh one of the approaches we use to develop safe and harmonious learning communities - Restorative Practices. Restorative Practices focuses on building, maintaining, and restoring positive relationships. You may be interested in viewing the **Adversity, Stress and Restorative Practice in Schools** webinar we participated in and can view it using this link https://youtu.be/hULB2JiJ9Hk. Hughesdale Primary has worked with Kristy, the presenter, for several years and all staff have completed training with her.

In Term 3, all students from Foundation to Level Six will continue the **Resilience**, **Rights and Respectful Relationships** Program. The teaching and support staff at Hughesdale PS have been busy undergoing professional development sessions which have built their capacity and confidence to administer the program effectively. One of the unique features of this program is that all students in the school explore the same topics at the same time, but each topic is taught in an age-appropriate manner specific to that year level and directly links to the Personal and Social Learning objectives outlined in the Victorian Curriculum. An outline for each of the following units we will explore this term is below:



PROBLEM SOLVING

Problem-solving skills are an important part of the coping repertoire. The classroom program provides a number of learning activities to develop students' problem-solving skills. The activities in the program assist students to develop their critical and creative thinking skills, and to apply them to scenarios exploring personal, social and ethical dilemmas.

HELP SEEKING

Learning activities in this topic area are designed to help students discuss the importance of seeking help and providing peer support when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone. This helps to normalise and destigmatise help -seeking behaviour. Scenario-based activities help students identify situations in which help should be sought, identify trusted sources of help, and practice seeking help from peers and adults.

Further information about the resources teachers will be using and specific lessons that will be taught can be found at Introduction Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships - FUSE - Department of Education & Training.

We are very much looking forward to another successful term exploring our Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships at Hughesdale Primary School.


Family Footy Fun, September 7th our
