We have had Billy Cart building incursions, a trip to Bentleigh Secondary College to celebrate International Womens' Day, Labour Day, A School Council Meeting (face-to-face for the first time!), raffle ticket sales for our Easter baskets, the Athletics Carnival, St Patrick's Day, Harmony Day and our first face-to-face school tour for families with Foundation children in 2022. A vibrant hub of activity that we all cherish so deeply.

Last week, 75 of our Year 4 & 5 girls visited Bentleigh Secondary College to participate in a STEM workshop celebrating significant achievements by women in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. Our students participated in a number of small group experiences including the exploration of DNA in a strawberry, harnessing air to propel a balloon rocket, hand structures and muscles. They learnt from senior student mentors and we asked as many questions as we could think of! Bentleigh students presented a drama performance where we 'met' Emelia Earhart, culminating in the identification of local and global issues that we would like to see addressed in the future.

This week, we have a group of students visiting John Monash Science School as part of Mini Mathematicians, Little Scientists Big Science, and Robogals programs. We are grateful that we can again participate in initiatives such as these to expand the experiences available to our students.




If you have any time to spare next Friday, the Parents and Friends group would appreciate some help wrapping these.

Curriculum and Pedagogy

John Monash Science School (JMSS)

JMSS is a specialist senior secondary school in the Sciences, Mathematics and Associated Technologies. This term our level 5 students were given the opportunity to apply for a position in a program run at JMSS, located on the Monash University campus in Clayton. The program is facilitated by their senior students with the support of volunteer university students.

Primary aged students from a variety of schools meet for an afternoon a fortnight to participate in the learning. We have students in three different classes:

- Little Scientists, Big Science
- Mini Mathematicians
- Robogals

We are grateful for the opportunity. Please enjoy this write up, by Vasa, on behalf of the Scientists group which also includes Daniel, Charlie B and Iha.

When the Year 5s went to John Monash Science School we did exciting and amazing experiments. They were fun and helped us learn more about physics. The two activities we did were independent propeller making and working together as a group to make a design suitable for the egg drop. Unfortunately our egg-drop design didn't make it but we still had excellent fun making and working together to learn more about science. We had to trial many different designs and ponder whether or not the design was going to be successful. Overall doing this course was great fun and we are excited to do this again in the coming weeks.


Cultural Studies has a new name!!





To Day I've been on a Billy ^{cart} with Oliver he was pushing me a round. You need someone to push you around so it moves. ✓








